It's a common experience for women business owners to get to a place when they're in rapid growth where they realize that they've gone as far as they can go alone. It's now time for you to consider where do you need help in the form of a mentor. Now, like you, I've been there, done that, and had some things that didn't work out so well, so in today's video, I'm excited to share with you some of the lessons I've learned in the hopes that you now can have clarity in choosing your next mentor.



Choosing a mentor can literally be one of the most powerful distinctions in growing your business and it requires some personal responsibility on our part when we're the ones doing the hiring. Whether you've had relationships that worked in the past or not, looking forward in a place of personal responsibility will help you choose the right mentor for you.

Now, the first thing I want you to consider is does your mentor have proven results helping others? Have they helped others in the area that you're needing help in? Sometimes we think we need help in one area and we need help in another area, but you should be able to find great references and referrals from others who have worked with this mentor and been happy with him or her, whoever it is.

The second thing is I want you to be really clear about their area of expertise. Don't make the mistake that I've made where I've hired someone to help me with something that wasn't in their wheelhouse. They might have been great at something else, but when I asked them to help me here, maybe because they liked me and I liked them and they wanted to help me, we've decided to partner and I didn't get great results. So make sure that the area of expertise that you know you need support in is actually their wheelhouse and their specialty.

The third thing I want you to consider is this. Most people who are very successful have a lot going on in their own lives, so when you're choosing someone to hire, to really partner with, I want you to check in to their availability. Is this going to be something where you're looking to have a reach out, you need to send them a text, you need to have a phone call, and they're not around because they've got so much going on in their own lives? Choosing a mentor who really makes you a priority and is available for you is super important.

I want to just throw in a little bonus thing that I look for these days. Our whole company is built on generosity and legacy and giving back and making a difference. When I hired my current coach and mentor, Kym Yancey, I really looked at the history of his organization, and he and his wife, Sandra, have been so committed to giving back in generosity. They're a perfect culture match for me. Think about this person that you're hiring. Do you like them? Is this somebody you like hanging out with and are they showing themselves to be generous? Are they going to be there for you and go above and beyond when you need help in your business? Check into this. Ask for references. Do your homework and take the time to invest in yourself wisely. It may be the best investment you'll ever make.
